Teach master drummer (leader) start and finish- 'Play the djembe' and open tone, bass tone and slap- children copy patterns and rhythms created by leader  African Drumming - Playing an Open tone (youtube.com)  African Drumming - Playing a Bass tone (youtube.com)  African Drumming - Playing a Slap (youtube.com)	Djembe, hold position, open tone, bass tone, slap, rhythm, pattern
2	L.G. I can play rhythms in a call and response song	Teach 'What's for dinner, mum' as the call - response 'eggs and baked beans'- change dynamics and tempo Children work in fours, one leader 'call' and other three are 'response'	Djembe, open tone, bass tone, slap, rhythm, dynamics, tempo, single strokes, double strokes
3	L.G. I can play part of a three-part arrangement	Warm up with 'Play the djembe and What's for dinner mum,' Introduce the three parts to 'Fanga'	As above Three-part arrangement
4	L.G. I can play rhythms in a call and response song	Continue work on 'Fanga' Introduce Che Che Kule (Year 2 Call and response song or could use alternative)- in groups create patterns and rhythms (leader and response)	As above

5	L.G. I can compose my own call and response rhythms	Recap rhythms to chants and songs taught so far.	As above Record compositions (symbols)
6	L.G. I can perform for an audience	Children to rehearse songs/ own compositions learnt ready to perform to another year group.	Perform, evaluate
