Our Community Environment

As a school we really try hard to look after our neighbourhood and our community and ask for your support to do this too. When you are waiting to collect your children at home time, please do not stand on our neighbours' gardens or drives; please stay on the pavement or other public land such as the green area. If you have litter to dispose of such as cigarette ends, chewing gum, sweet wrappers or drinks bottles, please use either of the two bins at the front of school on your way to the classrooms. One bin is located directly in front of our front door and the other is next to the wooden gates to the playground. Sports Day

Sports Day for Years 1 – 6 will be held at The Pingles Stadium is tomorrow, Tuesday 21st May. Adults are invited to attend the stadium to support the children. The day will be split into two sessions, Years 4, 5 & 6 will be participating in the morning, their adults are welcome to come and watch at 10am. Children will walk back to school for lunch. Years 1, 2 & 3 will be participating in the afternoon. They will eat lunch at school, then walk to the Pingles Stadium. Their adults are welcome to attend from 1:30pm. Afternoon children may be able to go home with their adult from The Pingles, they MUST be signed out by their teacher, all other children will walk back to school.

All children will be having lunch at school before or after their session, hot school dinners will be available as normal.

All children are advised to bring a raincoat, a sunhat and to wear suncream, dependant on the weather forecast, as they will be outside for a few hours.

Children MUST wear their PE kits to participate, if they have a t-shirt in the colour of their House Team please can they wear that. If you are unsure what House your child is in, please ask them as all children know what house they are in:




Nursery and Reception Sports morning is this Thursday 23rd May.

Children arrive to school as normal, in their sports clothing eg trainers, pumps, leggings, shorts and apply sun cream before they come to school. Sports day starts at 9.30 am on the field next to the playground. Spectators, please enter through the large gates in the car park. Water will be provided for all the children. Just to make you aware there will be no benches for parents to sit on but if you do require a chair/bench because you are unable to stand or sit on the grass please let a member of the Early Years team know and we will accommodate this.

Finally, if you have a child in nursery who attends in the **afternoon**, please come along at 9.30 am to join in the races and they can still return in the afternoon for their usual nursery session. You must stay with your 'afternoon' child.

We look forward to seeing you and do not forget there will be a parents and carers race for those who want to join in!



School Uniform

Please can we remind all families of the expectations for all children in Reception through to Year 6 to wear school uniform. Our school uniform is: Grey bottoms (trousers, skirt, pinafore dress, shorts); white polo shirt or white shirt; royal blue jumper, cardigan or fleece with or without the school logo. In the summer months children can also wear blue and white checked or striped dresses or playsuits. All children MUST wear sensible black school shoes. Please DO NOT allow your child to wear open toed sandals or 'crocs' to school. When children have PE they must wear pumps or trainers along with black shorts, short, joggers, or leggings with a plain white, round neck t-shirt. 

| Chickenpox | at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over |
| Diarrhoea and Vomiting | 48 hours after their last episode |
| Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19) | they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19 |
| Impetigo | their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics |
| Measles | 4 days after the rash first appeared |
| Mumps | 5 days after the swelling started |
| Scabies | they've had their first treatment |
| Scarlet Fever | 24 hours after they started taking antibiotics |
| Whooping Cough | 48 hours after they started taking antibiotics |
