Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 10th February 2025

Punctuality The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time. If the gate is locked and your child arrives through the main office doors, they are arriving late, and will receive a late mark, please avoid this and take a moment to explain to the office staff the reason.


- 616 minutes of learning time was lost due to children arriving late for school in one week. This is equivalent to over 10 hours which is almost 1 and half school days. First thing in the morning is the most crucial time of the day when children settle in and find out what they will be doing that day. Arriving late for school can have a massive impact on your child's education and wellbeing.
- No class had all of their children in school on time every day.

Remember to keep your child at home if they have a temperature of 38 or above. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must remain absent from school or nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.
