## Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 3rd February 2025

**Punctuality** The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time. If the gate is locked and your child arrives through the main office doors, they are arriving late, and will receive a late mark, please avoid this and take a moment to explain to the office staff the reason.

- **331 minutes** of learning time was lost due to children arriving late for school this week. This is almost a whole school day of lost learning. First thing in the morning is the most crucial time of the day when children settle in and find out what they will be doing that day. Arriving late for school can have a massive impact on your child's education and wellbeing.
- Well done to year 5 who were the only class to have all of their children arriving on time each day.

Remember to keep your child at home if they have a temperature of 38 or above. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must remain absent from school or nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.


## Happy Lunchtimes Table of Awesomeness Invites

Please check with your school for the best way to pay for your books


