Attendance and Punctuality for week beginning 24th February 2025

Punctuality The school gates open at **8:45am** & close at **8:55am** please arrive on time. If the gate is locked and your child arrives through the main office doors, they are arriving late, and will receive a late mark, please avoid this and take a moment to explain to the office staff the reason.

First thing in the morning is the most crucial time of the day when children settle in and find out what they will be doing that day. Arriving late for school can have a massive impact on your child's education and wellbeing.

- **210 minutes** of learning time was lost due to children arriving late for school this week.
- Year 1 had all of their children in school on time every day.

Remember to keep your child at home if they have a temperature of 38 or above. For sickness and diarrhoea, children must remain absent from school or nursery for 48 hours after the last episode.

Nursery Places

Did you know we admit children to our nursery, the term after their 3rd birthday? Depending upon your child's birthday, we have admissions in September, January and after the Easter holidays. Do you have a child who is not yet 3? It's never too early to put their name down on our waiting list. We offer 15 hours of free funding to all families, this could be 5 mornings, 5 afternoons or 2 full days plus a half session each week. We also accept families who are in receipt of a 30 hours funding code, these children can attend all day. Pop to the office for an admissions form.
