#### Feeling Safe

Some of our children have shared that they do not always feel safe when playing out in the community after school because of intimidating anti-social behaviour by older children who do not attend our school.

We are sharing this information with you so that if your children are allowed to play out in the community after school, you can talk to them to ensure that they feel safe and support them to have a plan that they can follow to find help, if needed.

#### **Our Community Environment**

As a school we really try hard to look after our neighbourhood and our community and ask for your support to do this too. When you are waiting to collect your children at home time, please do not stand on our neighbours' gardens or drives; please stay on the pavement or other public land such as the green area. If you have litter to dispose of such as cigarette ends, chewing gum, sweet wrappers or drinks bottles, please use either of the two bins at the front of school on your way to the classrooms. One bin is located directly in front of our front door and the other is next to the wooden gates to the playground. We appreciate your understanding and support to keep our entrance road and neighbours' gardens litter free and undamaged.



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# Should I keep my child off school?

	Until
Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
